

1. Alliteration	Repeating consonant sounds at the beginning of words
2. Allusion	an expression that calls something to a reader's mind by referring to a well-known story, person, or object
3. Assonance	repetition of vowel sounds in words.
4. Figurative language	Writing or speech that isn't meant to be taken literally
5. Hyperbole	exaggeration
6. Imagery	use of language to create mental images in the reader's mind
7. Irony	saying the opposite of what you actually mean
8. Metaphor	Describes one thing as if it were another; a direct comparison
9. Mood	a person's feelings
10. Onomatopoeia	Use of words that imitate sounds
11. Personification	Gives human qualities to something that isn't human
12. Poem	a group of words that are written to express or draw out emotion, paint a picture, or give a sense of beauty.
13. Poetry	a type of writing used to express emotions, experiences, & images with breaks in the lines of text to create a certain sound (has a beat, rhythm, & sometimes rhymes)
14. Prose	a group of words written in sentences and paragraphs, like you would read in a novel or essay
15. Repetition	Use any part of language (sound, word, etc.) more than 1 time
16. Rhyme	Repeating sounds at the end of words
17. Rhythm	Beat created by pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables
18. Sensory language	Writing that appeals to more than one of the reader's senses
19. Simile	Uses like or as to compare 2 unlikely things
20. Stanza	the lines of a poem that are grouped together
21. Tone	a speaker's attitude
22. Traditional Poetry	A type of poetry that follows specific rules regarding the number of lines, stanzas or rhyming patterns.
